

The Basic Rider Course is aimed at the beginner or re-entry rider. The course provides fundamentals of safe, responsible motorcycle riding and will include classroom instruction and practical riding in a controlled, off-street environment. The course concludes with a knowledge test and skill evaluation. Successful completion of this course allows waiver of the road test portion for motorcycle licensing in Missouri.

MANDATORY ITEMS FOR THIS COURSE:

- HELMET Full-face and 3/4 helmets are acceptable provided that they meet minimum DOT certification
- STURDY OVER-THE-ANKLE FOOTWEAR
- LONG SLEEVE SHIRT OR JACKET
- STURDY PANTS (NO SHORTS ALLOWED)
- **FULL FINGER GLOVES**
- **EYE PROTECTION**

Student must be a MINIMUM of 15 ½ years old the day the course begins and be able to ride a bicycle. Anyone under 18 years of age must have parental/guardian permission in writing prior to the riding portion of the course. Motorcycles will be furnished, you cannot use your own.

REFUNDS WILL NOT BE ISSUED IF YOU DO NOT PASS THE COURSE. (2-day course)



When coming from the West, East or Business 5 North, at the intersection of Hwy 54 & Business Route 5 in Camdenton, take Business Route 5 South. Travel 4/10 of a mile to the Camdenton Schools complex and turn left onto Laker Drive, then immediately take the slight right onto DARE Blvd. LCTC is the second building on the right.


