

A letter from the Superintendent

Dear Friends,

On May 19th, 2012, the Camdenton R-III School District held its 81st Commencement Ceremony. Three hundred five seniors were awarded their high school diplomas. The ceremony capped a very successful year in the District that began with our dedicated transportation department picking up our students on the first day, included the instructional efforts of our teachers and paraprofessionals, and ended with a wonderful graduation ceremony thanks to the support of our maintenance and custodial departments. This is by no means inclusive of all the departments that provide support for our students, but it does provide a brief glimpse of the teamwork and dedication we have in our District.

In order for a student to graduate from our District, the student must exhibit hard work and dedication to learning. The student must also have a support system to assist him/her on the journey. This support system includes loving parents and guardians and a community which values learning. This year local individuals, businesses, clubs, and civic organizations provided scholarships for our graduates that totaled \$250,299. We wish to thank these individuals and groups for their support of our Lakers.

Thanks to the support of our community and the dedication of our staff, Camdenton students receive a world-class and well-rounded education.

As a District, we welcome Mrs. Laura Martin to the Camdenton R-III Board of Education. Mrs. Martin fills the seat vacated by Mr. Randy Dickerson. Mr. Dickerson served our District for 12 years as a Board member.

In order for our District to meet our vision of "Everyone Learning Every Day" we must continue to plan for the future. We must provide our children the skills they will need to be successful in the future. We must provide our children a quality education in state-of-the-art facilities. We are facing the challenge of a building which has reached its student enrollment capacity at Osage Beach Elementary. We also face facility challenges at Hurricane Deck Elementary in regard to educational offerings for our students such as a satisfactory setting for the Library Media

Center and facilities for physical education classes, food services, plays, and presentations. We must strive to provide a 21st century education in schools equipped for this type education. We look forward to meeting these challenges in our future.

NATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF MUSIC MERCHANTS AWARD GRANTED TO THE CAMDENTON R-III SCHOOL DISTRICT.

The National Association of Music Merchants (NAMM) Foundation recently announced the results of its 13th Annual Best Communities for Music Education (BCME) survey. This survey acknowledges schools and districts from across the United States for their commitment and support for music education as part of the core curriculum. One hundred seventy-six education institutions, including 66 school districts and 10 schools, were recognized. This year the Camdenton R-III School District has been designated as a "Best Community."

This announcement came just prior to NAMM's "National Wanna Play Music Week," May 7-13. This is a week-long promotion designed to encourage people of all ages and skill levels to experience the proven benefits and fun of playing music.

The BCME survey is a nationwide search for communities that provide access to music education as an essential part of a complete education and exemplify commitment and support for music education. Each entity receiving the "Best Communities" designation scored in the 80th percentile or higher in the survey grading process. Participants in the survey answered detailed questions about funding, graduation requirements, music class participation, instructional time, facilities, support for the music program, and other relevant factors in their communities' music education programs. The responses were verified with district officials, and advisory organizations reviewed the data.

The NAMM Foundation is a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization dedicated to advancing active participation in music making and supporting scientific research, philanthropic giving, and public service programs from the music products industry.

The State of Missouri had only two other recipients of this award. On behalf of the Camdenton R-III community, we would like to thank you for your continued support in helping our District reach its vision of "Everyone Learning Every Day."

2012 Elementary Teacher of the Year



JACLYN JOHNSON

Jaclyn (Jackie) Johnson, fourth grade teacher at Hawthorn Elementary, was named the Camdenton R-III Elementary Teacher of the Year. She has taught in the District for four years; three as a third grade teacher, and this year in a fourth

grade position. Johnson is a life-long member of the Camdenton community, leaving only to earn her bachelor's degree from Missouri State University in Springfield, Missouri.

Having made the decision in third grade to become an educator, Johnson never looked back. She grew up in a family of teachers and this greatly influenced her choice. Watching former students connect with her mother, a retired Camdenton teacher, made her realize that teaching in a classroom was her opportunity to make a positive impact on children. She feels it is her responsibility to provide a positive and safe environment for her students to feel comfortable taking chances in learning. She finds it rewarding to have students who love to be in her classroom.

One aspect of teaching that Johnson highlights is "that light bulb moment" when her students feel the pride of accomplishment. She likes to be certain her class understands concepts and encourages them to take chances in order to learn. "I love to see them be proud of their accomplishments," states Johnson. "It makes me proud to give them this opportunity."

In keeping with her enthusiasm for learning, Johnson is currently working toward her Master's Degree in Elementary Administration. She is using the co-teaching model in her classroom this year and finds success using stations with her students. Some of her students serve as mentors and work with their classmates, while struggling students are able to work in small groups with teachers. Flex groups also move into her room for math and writing. She has incorporated foldables in her instruction, allowing students to write their thoughts in an organized manner. "I love using this tool in reading groups especially," says Johnson.

Johnson has volunteered for the past four years as the assistant girls' golf coach. "It has



been great to help coach the girls," she enthuses, "especially since I am a former Lady Laker golfer." She is a member of MSTA and serves on several school committees: Positive Behavior Support team, Writing Ad-Hoc, Acuity Training, Train the Trainer, Building Academic Vocabulary and the Common Core Committee.

2012 SECONDARY TEACHER OF THE YEAR



JACQUELINE WILSON

Jacqueline (Jackie) Wilson has been selected as the Secondary Teacher of the Year. She is the Culinary Arts Instructor at the Lake Career & Technical Center (LCTC). This is her fifth year in the Camdenton R-III School District, and her 21st year in education. Her bachelor's and

master's degrees were earned in Manhattan, Kansas, at Kansas State University. She has also studied and earned certifications in Culinary Arts from Chicago, Minneapolis, and South Carolina. Additionally, she has participated in culinary classes at the prestigious Le Cordon Bleu in Paris, France. Recently, Wilson was awarded a scholarship by the Lake Area Chamber of Commerce which enables her to work toward her Certified Secondary Culinary Educator certification.

does she get to work with young people as they develop life skills, she also is able to share her passion for cooking. "As a teacher, I am placed in the privileged position of being able to help students develop in so many areas of their lives beyond the classroom," says Wilson, "and to help build the kind of character, responsibility, and accountability that will contribute to their success professionally and personally as they continue on their journey."

It is easy for Chef Wilson to name the rewards of her career. She finds her students level of commitment and dedication, energy and resilience, and willingness to face challenges and take risks "heartwarming." Many of her students have "gone above grades or money or other external reward" by volunteering to cook for the tornado victims in Joplin, cooking and serving for a community group on a non-school day, or judging food contests on Saturdays. "Our platform allows us to enhance and support outside activities and programs, both cultural and charitable, and helps the students see the value of what they have to offer," states Wilson. "This sets an example for students of ways they can contribute to others

now and as adults." Wilson also credits her colleagues with making her job a pleasure. She finds the LCTC staff to be kind, thoughtful, generous, helpful and genuine. "These are good people to be surrounded by every day," says Wilson.

Finding it challenging to find enough time in the year to incorporate new projects or lessons, Wilson wants her students to feel they have gained something valuable every time they enter her class. Both culinary and life lessons are served up under her instruction. Wilson hopes her students will take advantage of their opportunities while in school, while also enjoying this special time in their lives.

Wilson has lived full time at the Lake for the past five years, but has been a regular visitor since 1963 when her grandfather purchased land and she and her siblings would spend summers here. Wilson now owns that property and shares her summers with her four children, their spouses and her two



grandchildren, taking her love of skiing, swimming and boating into the fourth generation of her family.

2012 EDUCATOR OF THE YEAR



JENNIFER LAKEY

Jennifer Lakey was selected for the honor of Camdenton R-III School District's Educator of the Year. She teaches kindergarten at Hurricane Deck Elementary and this is her 14th year in the District. She has also taught fifth

grade and third grade. Lakey earned her Bachelor of Science in Education from Missouri State University, her master's from Southwest Baptist University and is also certified through the Praxis exam in Early Childhood. To be chosen as Educator of the Year, teachers must be nominated by building administrators and have taught in the District for a minimum of ten years.

"I have always had a heart for children, especially those who needed extra support and attention," says Lakey. She enjoyed working with children from a young age, "setting rules in the neighborhood, and sending home those who didn't follow them," quips Lakey. In an early job at a daycare, she realized she had found her purpose in the world, to teach and love children.

With the rewards of her profession including relationships with her colleagues, relationships with her school families and watching her students gain self-esteem, Lakey finds satisfaction in her life at Hurricane Deck Elementary. "My colleagues are my second family. We support, challenge, cheer, pray, play, laugh, and cry with each other," states Lakey. "From our front office to custodians, bus drivers to paraprofessionals, volunteers to teachers, we all lean on each other for one common purpose, our kids!" She is constantly amazed by her former students and their families sharing their "life moments" with her when they see her. She believes it is a blessing to be "important enough" to get family updates from her former students and family members. However, Lakey feels the greatest reward of all is "building a child's self-esteem."

"I tell a kindergartener on day one that they will be a writer before leaving my class, and they look at me like I am crazy. Then there are months of practice, encouragement, practice, encouragement, practice and then...a miracle! I can read their writing before they read it to me! The look in their eyes when that happens is priceless. At that point, they believe they can do anything, because they never thought they would be writers, and now they are," tells Lakey. Because her teaching strength is in writing, she and fellow kindergarten teacher Mrs. Gibson, who is strong in math, collaborate to switch their classes for one period per day so that the students are able to benefit from their strengths. Lakey, with the support of her administrator and the parents, believes this strategy has pushed the kindergarteners to make more progress in writing and math.

Lakey is married to her husband, Chuck, and they have two sons and a granddaughter, Kaylee. She (Kaylee) is the only extra-curricular activity Lakey participates in during the school year. "We love to cook, read, play in her playhouse, go swimming, count stars and listen to the frogs sing," says Lakey. In the summer she can be found helping with the Laurie Hillbilly Barbeque Committee and scouring garage

sales and flea markets. She is a certified barbeque judge, and enjoys traveling in that capacity. Congratulations, Jennifer Lakey, on being selected as the Educator of the Year!



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A+ Scholars

Camdenton High School is one of 402 high schools in Missouri designated as an A+ School by the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education. The A+ Schools Program was created by state law as an incentive for improving Missouri's high schools. The primary goal of the A+ Schools Program is to ensure that all students who graduate from Missouri high schools are well prepared to pursue advanced education and/or employment.

One of the significant benefits of the program is that a designated A+ School may offer scholarships to students who maintain a minimum of a 2.50 Grade Point Average (GPA), attend school with a 95 percent attendance rate, complete 50 hours of unpaid tutoring and remain a good citizen.

Kelli Montgomery - John T. Belcher Award

Each year MSBA, through the FutureBuilders Foundation, awards seventeen scholarships to Missouri high school seniors. One recipient is selected from each of the seventeen MSBA-designated regions of the state. Those seventeen winners then compete for one larger scholarship. The regional winners are awarded \$750 scholarships and the statewide winner is awarded \$1500.



Scott Lange - National Merit Commended Student

The National Merit Scholarship Program is an academic competition for recognition and scholarships that began in 1955. High school students enter the National Merit Program by taking the Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test (PSAT/NMSQT®). The test serves as an initial screening of approximately 1.5 million students each year. Of the 1.5 million, approximately 50,000 with the highest scores qualify for recognition in the National Merit Scholarship Program. Of the 50,000, approximately 34,000 become Commended students.



Tyler Thielen - Missouri Fine Arts Academy

The Missouri Fine Arts Academy is a three-week summer residential program for approximately 150 of Missouri's artistically talented. The program is designed to provide unique challenges and opportunities for high school students who are exceptionally talented in the areas of music, art, theater, and dance.



National Honor Society

National Honor Society members must maintain a cumulative weighted GPA of 3.75, complete at least 20 community service hours each year of membership, and earn a minimum number of activity points.





CAMDENTON HIGH SCHOOL - BRONZE MEDAL WINNER



The Camdenton R-III School District would like to announce that U.S. News and World Report has named Camdenton High School as a bronze medal winner for one of the best high schools in the nation. Nearly 22,000 public high schools in 49 states and the District of Columbia were evaluated. Two percent, or the top 500 schools, were awarded gold status. Seven percent, or approximately 1,500 schools, were awarded

silver status. Thirteen percent, or approximately 2,900 schools, received bronze status. The remaining 78% of schools did not receive a status medal.

The evaluated schools were awarded status medals based on a three-step process. First, the schools were evaluated comparing student performance versus the average students in their state. Secondly, schools were evaluated on whether the school's least advantaged students performed better than the average similar students in the state. Finally, schools were evaluated on whether the school's students had high college level achievement. While this honor is bestowed upon Camdenton High School, this achievement is indicative of the entire Camdenton R-III School system and our community.
