Dear Friends,

The first semester has come and gone for the Camdenton R-III School District. Over the course of the first 18 weeks of the 2013-2014 school year a number of our staff members have received several honors.

Mr. Todd Shockley, Principal of Hawthorn Elementary School, was recently named the Distinguished Principal of the Year by the Southwest Missouri Association of Elementary School Principals. Mr. Shockley is also a candidate for the statewide principal's award through the Missouri Association of Elementary School Principals.

Jane Noyes, teacher at Camdenton Middle School, was recently bestowed two statewide awards. First, Jane was named the Missouri School Age Care Professional of the Year at the fall conference of the Missouri School Age Community Coalition Conference. Jane was also named as Coach of the Year for the Eastern Division of the FIRST LEGO League State Championship in St. Louis.

Angie Rogers, teacher at Hawthorn Elementary, was recently named the Elementary Missouri Council of Teachers of Mathematics Teacher of the Year.

Dr. Gail White, Director of Lake Career and Technical Center, and Senior student Sarah Wages were recently recognized as two of the Lake Area's Top 10 Women of the Year.

The Camdenton School District is made up of hundreds of fine staff members who work together to strive to achieve our common vision of "Everyone Learning Every Day!" Our school district also has bright and talented students who walk our halls every day. On the pages that follow you will get acquainted with a number of our award-winning students

as this issue highlights athletic and academic honors at the Conference, District, and Sectional levels.

Not only have individual members of our school family been recognized this year, exemplary programs have also been highlighted. The Afterschool Camdenton 4-H FIRST LASER robotics teams have been nominated by the Missouri Department of Elementary and Secondary Education as one of fifteen afterschool programs nationwide to be a part of the United States Department of Education's science technology and mathematics "STEM" showcase. The U.S. Department of Education will award three programs as exemplary national models by March 1st.

This past November, the district held groundbreaking ceremonies in Osage Beach and Hurricane Deck. Site clearing and excavation have begun for our elementary buildings at these locations. Completion of these projects is scheduled for spring of 2015. We are also beginning the bidding process to construct two more secure entry access points in our district. These points will be constructed at Hawthorn Elementary and Oak Ridge Intermediate Schools. Construction will take place during the summer of 2014.

At the December meeting of the Camdenton R-III School Board, the Board of Education voted to approve yet another way to communicate with our Board members. Camdenton R-III Afterschool Services Selected to Participate in National Elementary STEM Pilot Program



Camdenton R-III Afterschool Services is proud to announce its selection as one of just 44 schools in the United States invited to pilot the newest science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) program for students

in grades K-5. The elementary STEM program is designed and developed by Project Lead The Way (PLTW), the nation's leading provider of STEM education curricular programs for middle and high school students. By offering this new elementary STEM program to its students, Camdenton R-III is expanding its high-quality educational offerings for its students.

Studies show that students decide as early as second and third grade whether they like, and think they are good at, math and science. PLTW's elementary program is designed for students in kindergarten through fifth grades and will align with standards such as Common Core State Standards and Next Generation Science Standards. Through a series of topic-based modules, students will engage in design problems that encourage collaboration, analysis, problem solving, and computational thinking.

Denise Richardson, the instructor designated as the Master Teacher for the elementary pilot, will



help instruct the professional development for those teachers at Camdenton R-III who will be involved in the pilot program.

The 44 schools invited to participate in the pilot program will test 12 STEM modules and play an integral role in the development of the final version of the

curriculum by providing feedback on their experiences to the PLTW. This feedback will influence the development of engaging curriculum and balanced assessment for elementary students, and the creation of effective professional development for instructors.



The final version of the elementary program will be available to all school districts in the United States for the 2014-15 school year. Camdenton Afterschool Services was one of only two afterschool programs in the nation selected to pilot this exciting new elementary program.
