A Letter from the Superintendent



Dear Friends,

As we enter into 2015, it is my pleasure to share with you an accolade the district received in 2014. Camdenton High School was recognized by U. S. News & World Report as a bronze "Best High School." U.S. News & World Report annually honors high schools from across the country as "the best high schools in the nation". Camdenton High School has been recognized several times by U.S. News with this award and we are very proud to maintain our performance.

While we celebrate accomplishments such as this we always want to improve our performance. Our district has partnered with the University of Missouri-Columbia on a couple of initiatives to keep our district performing at a high level. First, our district is part of the Missouri Network

for Educational Improvement through the University. This is a joint initiative with the MU College of Education, the Missouri School Boards Association, Missouri State Teachers Association, and the Missouri Association of School Administrators. The Network is working cooperatively with the Baldrige Performance Excellence Program and the Excellence in Missouri Foundation as it helps our district become more intentional with our systems and processes.

The second partnership with MU involves growing our own leaders in the district. Dr. Chris Belcher, Assistant Professor in the College of Education at Mizzou, is facilitating a program in our district for future school leaders and administrators. Dr. Belcher brings a wealth of practical experience to the program. He is a retired superintendent of the Columbia Public School District in Columbia, MO. As a district we want to grow our own leaders the "Laker Way." Author Jim Collins spoke

about planning in this way in his book, <u>Good To Great</u>. Great organizations look to the inside many times to fill leadership positions while good organizations look to the outside for their solutions. Internal leadership moves help to produce sustained positive results.

Over the course of the next several months our district will continue its strategic planning process. The district will reflect upon our progress of our current strategic plan and develop updated goals, objectives, and plans to meet these measurable targets. Planning will take place through telephone interviews with patrons, face-to-face meetings with staff and patrons, and through electronic surveys. Our desire is to create a workable plan that is the result of collaborating with and listening to our community.

Our construction projects for our elementary schools at Osage Beach and Hurricane Deck are progressing. These buildings are scheduled to be occupied for our 2015 - 2016 school term.

It is a very exciting time to be a member of Laker Nation. We have a proud history, but our best times lie ahead. As always, it is a great day to be a Laker!

Bikes-4-Books

Dogwood is excited to announce the new program, Bikes-4-Books, which encourages children to read. With the leadership and coordination of the Masonic Lodge of Linn Creek, this fun and motivational program is underway at the Dogwood Elementary this school year.

In this program, students are asked to keep a log of reading time at home and turn it in monthly. Those students' names will be entered into a drawing, and two boys and two girls from each grade level - preschool, kindergarten, first grade, and second grade - will be the lucky recipient of a brand new bike and helmet! A total of 16 bikes will be given away.

The teachers are just as excited about this wonderful program as the students. Studies have shown a child who reads 20 minutes a day will have read 3,600 minutes in a school year. This same child will have been exposed to 1,800,000 words and rank in the 90th percentile on tests. Because reading is the beginning foundation of student success it is important for each child to read every night.

Cole Bradbury, a member of the Masonic Lodge, is heading up the event and has already received 12 bikes thus far donated by these local businesses: Camden County Sheriff's Department, Camden County Renovations, Masonic Lodge, Tender Hands Caring LLC, Hulett Chevrolet, 55 Creative, and the

February is Career and Technical Education Month



CTE Month® (Career & Technical Education) is an annual celebration held in February. This year's theme is Recognizing Classroom Innovators. LCTC is proud to be a part of CTE, and to celebrate we have several activities planned, including: SkillsUSA student participation in district competitions, Missouri Association for Career and Technical Education (MOACTE) Legislative Day in Jefferson City, celebration of FFA Week (February 21-28) that includes the FFA Booster Dinner on February 27 which will have both Silent and Labor Auctions. Mark your calendars to attend the annual LCTC Open House, in partnership with the Camdenton Area Chamber of Commerce, on February 24 from 4-7 PM. Student demonstrations will take place, and tasting stations featuring local restaurants and LCTC's Culinary Arts program will be available.

New Classroom and Lab for Law Enforcement Program

Students enrolled in Lake Career & Technical Center's (LCTC) Building Trades program, under the supervision of Construction program instructor Ryan Bearden, have



had the opportunity to utilize the construction techniques they are learning in class as they build new classroom and lab space at LCTC.

Students are currently gaining

valuable commercial construction experience by building and finishing classroom and lab space for LCTC's new Law Enforcement program. When LCTC dedicated their most recent building expansion in the spring of 2011, a 6,400 square-foot portion, or "shell area", was left unfinished for future program expansion. Based

upon student interest and advisory committee input, and with approval from Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE) and the school district, Law Enforcement was added to LCTC's program offerings for the current school year. Officer Chris Edgar, Law Enforcement program instructor, and his students occupy a temporary classroom and lab space for the moment, and are

anticipating moving into their new "home" very soon. "We are excited about our new classroom and lab being available for us this year and appreciate the high level of quality and workmanship of Mr. Bearden and his students," Edgar stated.

In the past, LCTC's Building Trades program has been known in the community for building new homes - a product of students learning all aspects of the construction



process. However, for the past three years, students have worked on commercial construction projects to benefit the Camdenton school district.

After construction on the last building trades house was completed in the spring of 2012, the construction and real estate market in the Lake area was slow-moving due to the economic downturn experienced by the entire country. It was a logical choice to focus Building Trades students' efforts on completing much-needed, smallerscale construction projects on the Camdenton schools campus that did not require outside contractor supervision. In addition to their current project, the most recent commercial construction project completed by Building Trades students was a "red iron" structure that is used to house live animal projects for LCTC's Agricultural Education program. Looking ahead, the next project on the horizon for Building Trades students once the Law Enforcement classrooms are completed is building and finishing a meat processing classroom and lab inside of the animal projects barn.

LCTC is very fortunate to have several excellent business and community partners in the Lake area who generously

help the Building Trades students and instructor by sourcing equipment and building supplies, as well as providing mentoring and training in more specialized construction practices. These partners teach students skills such as drywall installation and finishing, painting, and electrical and plumbing techniques during the construction process, passing on their knowledge and expertise while working

alongside students on projects. Students also learn about the city inspection process and building code requirements for new construction as they work with the local building inspector and fire marshal during all phases of construction. "Having business and community partners, professionals in their field, come in to teach and work with students deepens their learning experience. Many of these people also play a vital role as advisory committee members in helping to continuously improve our program curriculum through their expertise and knowledge," noted Bearden.

LCTC offers career and technical education courses and programs to high school students at Camdenton, Climax Springs, Macks Creek, and School of the Osage high schools and adult students in a variety of career fields that prepare students to be career and college ready upon graduation.

Many of our patrons are familiar with the research and the writings of Jim Collins. Collins researched and wrote about what makes some organizations exceptional while many others are stuck being good. One factor that sets great companies apart from good companies was looking within the organization for leadership potential. Many good companies looked to the outside for their silver bullet, but great companies saw potential in their employees and grew that potential into skills.

In an effort to grow our own leaders in the Camdenton R-III School District we have partnered with the College of Education at the University of Missouri-Columbia. Dr. Chris Belcher, Professor at MU, is helping to facilitate the Camdenton R-III Leadership Academy. Dr. Belcher recently retired as the Superintendent of Schools in the Columbia, Missouri School District. Previous to his service in Columbia Dr. Belcher served as an administrator in the Kearney, Warrensburg, and Blue Springs School Districts.

He is widely respected across our state and across the nation as a visionary leader.

The Camdenton R-III Leadership Academy is comprised of twenty educators in our district who were identified as leaders who might want to, at some point in their career, become a building administrator. These individuals volunteered to meet over the course of this school year to learn about their own leadership potential and learn what it is like to be a building level leader. This group is quite impressive and we look forward to them taking the reins of leadership in the future. Our future is in great hands!

"Everyone Learning Every Day" is more than a slogan for the faculty and staff of Hawthorn Elementary. This vision serves to remind us of our fundamental purpose and acts as our "Compass North" to guide all of our improvement efforts. For the 2014-15 school year a re-alignment of

fiscal resources allowed for two instructional coaches positions to be created along with the addition of a second guidance counselor. Students and teachers are benefitting from this restructuring. Support for students' social-emotional needs have been greatly enhanced as evidenced in part by significant improvement in student attendance. Students have also benefitted from more project-based learning opportunities designed to engage students in real-world, hands-on application of their learning. Instructional coaches support teacher practices across all content and include the integration of technology into the instructional process. Teacher collaboration, common lesson



planning, and the support of the instructional coaches have caused a more consistent, coherent delivery of our district curriculum. Recently, Hawthorn has been presented an opportunity to partner with the University of Missouri Hook Center for Educational Leadership and the Missouri Network for Educational Improvement (MNEI). This partnership will provide the technical support enabling us to better prioritize, communicate, and evaluate current practices to identify points of needed change. Key indicators of highly effective organizations are described by the Malcolm Baldrige Quality Award Program. These indicators have been adopted throughout our district to promote excellence and equity and include:

- 1) student and stakeholder focus, 2) strategic alignment,
- 3) administrative leadership, 4) process management,
- 5) data analysis, 6) student outcomes, and 7) culture/climate. These indicators provide the means to measure our improvement efforts. We are extremely excited to capitalize on the expertise provided through the Hook Center and the MNEI, coupled with the time-proven principles of the Baldrige process. Utilizing these two tremendous resources positions



Hawthorn and all the schools within the R-III district for sustainable, improved performance congruent with our district's mission "to create a learning community that maximizes each individual's performance for future success."


