

A letter from the Superintendent

During the past few months, the Camdenton R-III District has opened new and updated elementary schools in our district. The new building in Osage Beach and the expansion and renovation of the building at Hurricane Deck are two prime examples of how we are working to give our students the skills and abilities to solve the problems of the future. Thanks to your support of the successful bond issue of April, 2013, these new state-of-the-art buildings are able to offer the educational benefits our students need in order to compete in the 21st century. Your support of the bond issue has enabled additional local funding to flow to our other facilities in the district to equip them with additional resources, including technology, to help enhance the learning and teaching process.

As of September 30, 2015, our district PreK-12 enrollment was 4,318. The enrollment by building as compared to last year is as follows:

Late this summer, the district also made security upgrades at Camdenton High School. These additional security measures include additional video surveillance and a "buzz in" system at the front door. Visitors to the high school are identified at the front door, then "buzzed" into the building to then enter into the front office.

New bricks and mortar are only a small part of readying our children to think in different ways to solve the challenges of the future. We, as their teachers, must enhance and refine our practices. This is why the district has moved toward modifying our school calendar to allow for professional collaboration time on Fridays. During this time our staff members work as professional learning communities. These communities are tied together by six characteristics:

- 1. Shared mission, vision, values, and goals all focused on student learning
- 2. A collaborative culture with a focus on learning
- 3. Collective inquiry into best practice and current reality
- 4. Action orientation or learning by doing
- 5. A commitment to continuous improvement
- 6. Results orientation

We cannot achieve our primary task of learning for every child in our district if our teachers do not work in a collaborative environment. In the book, "Revisiting Professional Learning Communities at Work: New Insights for Improving Schools," the authors state in order for schools to become more effective they must break the industrial model under which they were created. Collaboration assists the district in becoming more effective.

Thank you for your continued support of our school district. It is an honor to serve as your superintendent of schools.





- In November 1998, Missouri voters approved an amendment to the Constitution authorizing Boards of Education to levy up to \$2.75 per \$100 assessed valuation without a vote of the people.
- Actual Tax Levied for Operations \$2.56

 This is the part of the school tax levy dedicated to operations (Incidental Fund \$1.33+Teachers Fund \$1.18+Capital Projects Fund \$0.05 = \$2.56).
- Tax Required for Debt Retirement \$.31

 This is the part of the school tax levy set by the Camdenton R-III Board of Education for debt retirement.

CHS ACT Scores Remain Above the State Average

The Camdenton R-III School District is pleased to announce that the average ACT scores for the graduates of 2015 remain above the state average composite scores. The ACT consists of curriculum-based tests of educational development in English, Mathematics, Reading, and Science. These tests are designed to measure the skills needed for success during the first year of college coursework.




