Carol Dweck, in her book Mindset, tells a powerful story about George Dantzig, a graduate student in Math at Berkeley. George ran into class late and quickly copied two homework problems. Later he worked on these

problems. He found them difficult and it took him several days to solve them. He later found out these problems were not for homework. They were two famous math problems that had never been solved.

The Camdenton District is ever committed to our vision of "Everyone Learning Every Day." We must strive to help our students develop a growth mindset. In other words, we must help our students take the limits off of their expectations. Likewise, as their teachers, we must have limitless expectations for them.

Over the course of the past few months, our district and staff have received some wonderful honors. The Camdenton R-III School District won the Transforming Teaching and Learning in a Rural District Award from the Southern Regional Education Board. The district partnered with the SREB in 2014 to improve the college and career readiness of our students. The SREB will also feature our district's academic improvement efforts in an upcoming newsletter.

Jackie Jenkins, Director of Lake Career and Technical Center, was selected as the Missouri Career and Technical Education's Administrator of the Year. Mrs. Jenkins and the staff at LCTC are working diligently to prepare our students for in-demand occupations and post-secondary training.

Jody Hilton, Social Studies and English/Language Arts teacher at Oak Ridge Intermediate, was one of seven finalists for the 2016-2017 Missouri Teacher of the Year. The Missouri Department of Elementary and Secondary Education recognizes the efforts of effective teachers through the Teacher of the Year Program.


First Quarter 2016



LASER TEAMS REPRESENT AT THE WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP!

It was a banner season for the *FIRST*® LASER robotics teams from the Camdenton R-III Afterschool Services program. The 2015-2016 season wrapped with exciting recognition for several teams.

The High School LASER 3284 team was once again honored with the prestigious and highest award FIRST® gives, the Chairman's Award, for a third consecutive year and qualified to return to the World Championship for the sixth year! The Chairman's Award is bestowed upon the team that best represents a model for other teams to emulate and best embodies the purpose and goals of FIRST® (For Inspiration Recognition of Science & Technology). The Chairman's Award is based on the overall work of the team as a whole. The LASER 3284 team has given over 100 presentations at the local, state, and national levels. The Chairman's presenters were Kylie Becker, Kyle Funke, Hailey Green, and Josh Harmon. The team's goal is to become a Hall of Fame Team, which would allow them to compete at the World Championship every year.

In addition, the 3284 high school team was also awarded their seventh Industrial Safety Award, sponsored by Underwriters Laboratories (UL) and the Motorola Quality Award.



The team was thrilled to have team member Brenden Barbour named, as one of ten students worldwide, to the *FIRST*® Dean's List. The Dean's List Award began in 2010 to celebrate outstanding student leaders whose passion for and effectiveness at attaining *FIRST*® ideals is exemplary. In an effort to recognize the leadership

and dedication of the FIRST® most outstanding FIRST® Robotics Competition students, the family of Dean Kamen, a founder of FIRST® Robotics competition, sponsors this award for the selected top students.

The students who earn FIRST® Dean's List Award status are great examples of student leaders who have led their teams and communities to increased awareness for FIRST® and its mission and have achieved personal technical expertise and accomplishments. It is the intention of FIRST® that these students will continue on, post-award, as great leaders of the ever growing FIRST® student alumni community and as advocates of FIRST®. Brenden and High School LASER Coach Mitch Comer traveled to FIRST® headquarters in New Hampshire and toured DEKA, MIT and



Brenden attended a camp at Worcester Polytechnic Institute in Massachusetts. Kylie Becker was named as a semifinalist for the Dean's List at the St. Louis Regional competition.

The high school team also qualified for the annual State Championship and placed in the top ten teams in the state for the last seven years of the LASER program. At the State Tournament, Mitch Comer was named the *FIRST*® Robotics Competition Coach of the Year by his peers. Coach Comer has been instrumental in growing *FIRST*® in Missouri and representing *FIRST*® on numerous state committees.

The Camdenton Middle School also saw success as two teams qualified to advance to the State Championship held at the Missouri University of Science and Technology in March. The *FIRST*® Tech Challenge was a program originally designed for



high school students. In addition, all four Middle School LASER teams were in the quarter or semifinals at the UMKC qualifying tournament. The middle school teams compete against teams that are made up mostly of high school students.





Two FIRST® LEGO® League JR. LASER teams also packed their bags and traveled to the World Championship Expo to compete with teams from 61 countries. The JR. teams each brought home awards in the Against All Odds category and Construction Innovation. The trophies were made in Denmark and designed by LEGO® Master Builders. The teams were students from Osage Beach Elementary, Dogwood Elementary, and Hawthorn Elementary.

The Camdenton High School 3284 team will host three official *FIRST*® events for Mid Missouri this school year. The Mid MO *FIRST*® LEGO® League tournament will take place at Camdenton High School November 12, the Mid MO *FIRST*® Tech Challenge tournament will be held at Camdenton High School December 17, and the Mid MO *FIRST*® LEGO® League JR. Expo will be held in the spring at Osage Beach Elementary. Numerous volunteers will be needed to host these events in our community. All volunteers must sign up through the *FIRST*® volunteer system and pass background checks. Sponsors are also needed to help make this event special for teams traveling to the Lake area. Camdenton R-III School District Earns AdvancED Accreditation




Camdenton R-III School District once more earned accreditation from AdvancED. AdvancED is the parent organization of the North Central Association Commission on Accreditation and School Improvement (NCA CASI), Northwest Accreditation Commission (NWAC) and the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Council on Accreditation and School Improvement (SACS CASI). This action was taken at the AdvancED Accreditation Commission meeting held in Tempe, Arizona in June 2016.

AdvancED provides nationally-recognized accreditation, the purpose of which is continuous school improvement focused on increasing student performance. To earn accreditation, schools must meet high standards, be evaluated by a team of professionals from outside the school and implement a continuous process of school improvement.


