Score 1.5	Partial understanding of the 2.0 content with major errors or gaps in 3.0 content.
Score 1.0	With help, a partial understanding of the 2.0 content with major errors or gaps in 3.0 content.
Score 0.5	With help, a partial understanding of the 1.0 content.
Score 0	Even with help, no understanding or skill demonstrated.
